Cultural Heritage Student Mobility Scholarships

EU4Dialogue Programme

In the framework of the EU4Dialogue programme co-financed by the European Union and led by the DAAD, Campus France and the other partners are organising several activities and events for cultural heritage professionals and students from the South Caucasus and Moldova.

Summary of the EU4Dialogue mobility programme

As a pilot initiative managed by Campus France, selected students/young professionals will receive a scholarship to undertake one semester within a Master's programme in the field of cultural heritage in France, at the University Lumière – Lyon 2, starting August 28, 2023. The EU4Dialogue mobility programme does not guarantee an automatic recognition or transfer of academic credits possibly earned during the semester at the University Lumière – Lyon 2.

As the courses of the Master's programme will be mainly taught in French, the study semester will be preceded by intensive French language courses during the summer and a two-week French language course at the University Lumière – Lyon 2, called "stage PRUNE". Furthermore, during the study semester, a French language course will be offered by the University Lumière – Lyon 2 through the FEMI programme (French for internationally mobile students).

Description of the EU4Dialogue mobility programme

In the framework of the mobility scheme, the following activities will be fully covered:

1) <u>Pre-sessional intensive French language courses</u>

The selected students/young professionals will be able to follow physical or online French language courses at an Institut Français or Alliance Française in their home country/region, or at an institution in France, during the summer. The exact format (number of hours per week, individual or group sessions, physical or online sessions, etc.) will be defined individually for each scholarship holder depending on their level and needs and the regulations of the EU4Dialogue programme.

2) <u>Two-week French language course – "stage PRUNE" (Pre-entry university programme) at the</u> <u>University Lumière – Lyon 2</u>

The pre-entry university courses are intended for international students who participate in a mobility scheme at the University Lumière – Lyon 2 University.

3) <u>Study programme at the University Lumière – Lyon 2</u>

The scholarship holders will be able to follow modules from the following study programmes. The selection of modules will be made at a later stage, based on their profile and needs.

• Master 1 & 2 *Histoire de l'Art - Patrimoine-Architecture-Mondialisation* (Art History-Heritage-Architecture-Globalisation)







- Master 1 & 2 Histoire *Construction des Sociétés Contemporaines* (History Contemporary Societies' Construction)
- Master 1 & 2 Histoire *De la Renaissance aux Révolutions* (History From the Renaissance to the Revolutions)
- Master 1 & 2 Histoire Histoire, Mémoires, Médias (History History, Memories, Media)
- Master 1 & 2 *Information-Communication* / Médiations Urbaines, Savoirs et Expertises (Urban Mediation, Knowledge and Expertise)
- *Licence professionnelle Animateur-concepteur en Patrimoine culturel* (Professional Bachelor's Degree Cultural Heritage Facilitator-Designer)
- 4) <u>French for internationally mobile students (FEMI)</u>

This French language course is in addition to the modules from the Master's programme taken at the University, at the rate of one or two classes per week, depending on the scholarship holders' level (1 hour 45 minutes or 3 ½ hours per week). In the FEMI the scholarship holders will be introduced to the methodology of university work while strengthening their general language skills.

5) Internship with a supervisor from the University Lumière – Lyon 2

After the Master's programme, the scholarship holders will be encouraged to undertake, if possible, a professional internship, with the assistance of a supervisor from the University Lumière – Lyon 2.

Scholarship

The full amount of the scholarships available is 1250 euros per month, which covers costs such as visa application fees, round trip tickets to and from France, tuition fees, French language courses, accommodation and living costs in Lyon. In all cases, the amount perceived by the selected scholarship holders will be maximum 1250 euros per month. The exact amount perceived by the scholarship holders may vary depending on the costs that Campus France may cover directly.

Conditions to apply

Eligibility criteria

- Residents of the South Caucasus and Moldova
- Students enrolled at Master's level university course *or* about to graduate from a Master's level university course *or* recently graduated with a Master's level university degree
- Lack of any other scholarship during their mobility period in France
- Timely submission of the application with all the required documents

Documents to provide

- Statement from the applicant's present university confirming the student's enrollment in a Master's level university course *or* stating the provisional date of the student's graduation from a Master's level university course *or* a copy of a recent Master's level university degree
- Application form duly filled in (see attachment)
- CV and a motivation letter (preferably in English or French, otherwise in Russian)
- Passport copy

Deadline: Sunday 25 June at 23:59







How to apply

Send an email by the deadline (Sunday 25 June at 23:59) to <u>eu4dialogue@campusfrance.org</u> containing all the required documents. The subject line of the application email should contain the following information: **EU4Dialogue mobility programme - Application: First name, Last name**. If the application is relevant and eligible, Campus France will contact the applicant shortly afterwards to arrange a short online interview.

Selection criteria

Eligible applications will be evaluated according to the following selection criteria:

Criteria	Scoring (whole and half-points are possible)
Motivation and relevance of the application	Up to 30 points
Academic background	Up to 40 points
Knowledge of the French language	Up to 20 points
Knowledge of the English language	Up to 10 points

A threshold of 50 points is necessary for an application to be placed in the ranking list.

The available scholarships will be awarded to applicants following the order of the ranking list. A reserve list will also be drawn up. The scholarships holders will have to sign an agreement with Campus France before the beginning of the mobility period.

Engagement

It is the responsibility of the scholarship holders requiring a visa to make the necessary consular procedures on time to obtain a visa for France. Campus France may assist them in filing the application for a visa for France but it cannot guarantee its delivery. For this reason, in the event of a visa refusal, they must inform Campus France without delay. No costs will be reimbursed to selected scholarship holders who are not able to take part in the EU4Dialogue mobility programme for whatever reason.

Privacy and personal data protection policy

Campus France will only collect, use and store the applicants' personal data which are strictly necessary for the purposes of the present call for applications and in accordance with the European Union's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Campus France will process the applicant's personal data in order to evaluate the received applications and, for the selected applicants, in order to manage the scholarship administrative and financial aspects. Campus France will only share the applicants' personal data with specified and authorized recipients. These include (but are not limited to) the following: internal Campus France departments; Campus France's technical service providers; Campus France's partners or co-contractors; the relevant departments of the University Lumière – Lyon 2. Campus France will only save the applicants' personal data for the amount of time that is required to fulfill the purposes for which they were collected or to comply with all applicable legal obligations. The applicants have the right to ask Campus France to grant them access to their personal data at any time, the right to correct or erase them, the right to restrict their processing, the right to object to their processing and the right to request their personal data portability.
